
Use crayons to measure a variety of things in your home. "The chair is ___ crayons long."

Match a crayon with something that has the similar color. Talk about if it is living or nonliving.

Take a coloring page and turn it into a 'color by number' page. Children match numbers with colors and color that space.

Use crayons as the sides of shapes – make a triangle, diamond, square, rectangle, pentagon, star, or octagon.

Make an AB, ABC, or ABB pattern using colors!



Use crayons to practice "rainbow printing" letters – print the letter 3 or 5 times layering the colors on top of each other.

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
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
